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INTRODUCTION

KNOW YOUR WORK-AT-HOME OPTIONS

If you have often imagined finding employment that will enable you to live life with more time for your family, this book will help you focus on the important steps you need to take to make that dream come true.

After reading this e-book you will be focused and ready to find a work-at-home job.

Before we get started, there is one secret to finding a home job that we would like to tell you about. To be successful, there is one very important quality that you need to have: Flexibility.

The Internet has made it possible for moms to find real opportunities for home jobs, telecommuting and freelance work. However, to find the right opportunities, you have to be open to all of the possibilities. When you limit your focus, you limit your chances.

In a perfect world, every mom who wanted to would be able to find one job that allowed her to work at home for one company. Your ideal may be to get a job just like that. While this is possible, there is more than one pathway to at-home employment. We are going to explore all of those options here.

One note of caution: The anonymity of the internet means that unfortunately there are some scams out there. It is easy to be swept along with a site that offers you the opportunity to get rich for a small initial fee. Often though, the initial fee turns out not to be so small. The opportunity may be harder to profit from than you expected, or may not even exist at all. When you ask for a refund, there may be no response from the promoter who could be in another country where laws are not so strict.

However, there is nothing new about scams. The internet may expose us to more of them just as it exposes us to more of everything, but bogus money making schemes have been around since money was first invented. One of the best known offline scams was the envelope stuffing scheme. If you see an ad for making money by stuffing envelopes ('just send us a \$5 bill') don't do it! You will probably just be told to make money by placing the same ad yourself. The same goes for assembling toys or baby clothes at home. You pay a fee and then get the elements to assemble. Your sample will never be good enough and you will have lost the fee you paid.

The best way to know you can trust an opportunity is to find a trusted resource and follow their recommendations. A resource like HomeWorkingMom.com, the website of Mothers' Home Business Network. For 25 years, MHBN has been helping moms work at home and HomeWorkingmom.com has been online for 12 years.

CHAPTER 1

HOME JOBS VS. FREELANCE VS. TELECOMMUTING -WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE?

We have all heard the saying, "A rose by any other name smells as sweet." A home job is a home job, no matter what you call it. Some telecommute, some work freelance, and others just find a home job. All of these options allow a mom to work at home. Traditionally, freelancers are independent people who seek special assignments from a variety of companies. Telecommuters, on the other hand, are hired by one company to do the same job on a daily basis either part-time or full time from home and transmit their work to their employer. Today, it is possible to get short and long-term assignments from a variety of companies that can be considered freelance or telecommuting...or just plain work-at-home jobs depending on the length and nature of the assignment and the viewpoint of the company providing the opportunity.

In the online world, home jobs, freelancing and telecommuting are words that can almost be interchangeable. Do you have secretarial, administrative, writing, design, or marketing skills? Each of these skills can be used in a home job, to work freelance or to telecommute. This is where flexibility and creative thinking come in.

The message here is simple but important. If you want to be a telecommuter, consider freelance as another option. If you thought freelance work was your answer, consider short-term telecommuting projects. If you are looking for a home job, consider all three options.

If you still feel that a long-term telecommuting job is the only answer for you, consider seeking full or part-time employment outside your home with a family-friendly company and then try to get into their telecommuting program. It is unusual for a company to hire someone to telecommute without spending time working onsite first.

CHAPTER 2

DISCOVERING YOUR HOMEWORKING TALENTS and SKILLS

Some people are born with talents that allow them to attract at-home assignments. Others learn or develop new skills in school or on the job that can be used to do work at home. If you want to work at home and don't feel that you have any real talents or skills, don't give up. There are ways to identify your talents and develop your skills that will help you go from dreaming about working at home to actual at-home employment.

SET YOUR GOAL

Have you ever had a desire, set a goal, created a plan of action and then accomplished your goal? You may not realize it, but you follow this plan of action every day of your life. When you are hungry (desire), you decide to have a meal (goal), gather the ingredients and cook (plan of action) and then eat a wonderful meal (goal accomplished). Tired? You decide to go to bed, do the necessary tasks to get you there, and then go to sleep. Once again, desire, goal, plan of action, goal accomplished. Sure, these are ordinary, everyday activities but they clearly demonstrate the steps you need to take -and that you already do take -to transform your dreams into realistic accomplishments.

FIRST, BELIEVE IT IS POSSIBLE

What happens when you misplace your keys? If you used them to let yourself in the house, you know that they are there, somewhere and will look until you find them. If someone else opened the door with their keys, you may feel that your keys fell out of your bag or were left in a store, and you won't give the house search your full effort. The same type of attitude can affect the success of your freelance and telecommuting job search. If you believe that the opportunities are there, you will work hard to find them.

BE WILLING TO TRY

Have you ever watched a baby learn to walk? The little ones don't wait for the perfect moment and then get up and walk all over the house. Even though crawling is comfortable, they are not satisfied. They stand up, hold on, and begin to move forward on their feet. Each time they fall, they get up again and try harder. Eventually, toddlers learn to walk and then run. If you approach your telecommuting and freelance job search with the same determination and commitment, success will be yours.

REPACKAGE AND RENEW YOUR LIFE EXPERIENCES

What are you good at? What types of jobs have you done? What is your favorite hobby? Write down all of the skills and experience that you have developed doing these activities. Think creatively. Can you parlay sales experience into a marketing job? Can you qualify for a special project by using your secretarial skills? Does your volunteer work for the PTA put you in a position to apply for a public relations project? Do you love to do research on the Internet? Have you learned enough to become an Internet researcher?

What types of job or project listings appeal to you? Can you take some courses to become more qualified? Is self-help an option? Can you teach yourself what you need to know by reading and doing research?

You can create a new reality by combining the skills and talents you already have with the commitment to do what is necessary to succeed.

CHAPTER 3

That is all I owned, and I got \$90 for it. Those were the toughest times. Our first member joined on December 21st. Since then, we have experienced tremendous growth. I believe that is because our members are our priority and it shines through.

Rita: A number of job listings are local, but in locations all over the country. This is a condition of the current job market, especially in administrative jobs that require quick exchanges of work. However, we do have a variety of positions in other categories that are nationally and globally available. Members often find temporary work while searching for their ideal match. More and more companies are acquiring enhanced technology that will help more national listings become available.

DECIDE TO SUCCEED, EXPECT TO FAIL (SOMETIMES)

No one likes to be told that their work is unacceptable. But it is especially difficult to have your writing rejected. The great majority of people who want to become freelance writers submit one article. When a rejection is received, the writer often feels that her worst fears have been confirmed: She can't write. So, she gives up. This is a very big mistake.

Freelance submissions get rejected for many reasons. Bad writing is only one of them. The rejection could have occurred because the topic may have been covered recently, or the piece was not submitted to an appropriate place...or the editor had a bad day. The reason really doesn't matter. It is important, however, to decide at the very beginning of your career that rejection is just one part of the acceptance process. Until you are willing to take the chance of being rejected, you will never have your work accepted. The baseball players who hit the most home runs also strike out the most. But the strikeouts don't take away one bit of the glory of hitting one out of the park. Instant success cannot be expected in any profession. Becoming a freelance writer is a process. Anyone with a little talent, a willingness to learn and a lot of perseverance can succeed.

CHAPTER 5

TELECOMMUTING INSIDE INFORMATION

Telecommuting or Telework is a growing trend that allows you to work at home as an employee. More than 12 million employees telework more than 8 hours per week, up from 6 million in 2000. The number will hit 14 million by the end of 2009. If you want to be one of them, we have some advice: Change your focus.

It is very normal to approach a situation from your personal point of view. In this case, you want to work at home as an employee as a way to manage mothering and work. You know how important it is to develop a family-friendly work life. Your entire focus is on getting what you want. This is a mistake. If you want to convince your current employer to let you telecommute or get hired by a new company as a telecommuter you have to put your needs on the back burner and think only of the needs of your employer.

Picture this: You walk into a shoe store looking for a pair of comfortable shoes. You find what you want and when you tell the clerk he suggests that you buy a pair of high heels instead. He says, "Please, buy these shoes. I need you to buy these shoes. If you buy these shoes my life will be so much better." Does his argument persuade you to buy the high heels? No, it does not. But what would you do if the clerk said, "These shoes would go perfectly with the outfit you are wearing. This heel would make you look taller. Although this is a high heel, this shoe was designed for comfort. And, they are on sale!" You would certainly respond more positively to the second argument.

When you are trying to create a telecommuting position, you play the part of the clerk in the shoe store and your employer is the buyer. Unless you present a plan created from your employer's point of view, you won't be able to sell them on letting you telecommute. So, your first step to telecommuting is to learn about and convey the benefits of telecommuting to your employer.

To help you present this new point of view, consider the following:

- Studies show that telecommuting increases worker productivity approximately 15-20%
- Companies with telecommuting programs need less on-site office space, which can save 25-90% of rental costs.
- Every dollar that is invested in technology cuts business costs by \$2.
- Telecommuting decreases downtime created by bad weather, sickness or other factors that cause employees to take a day off. If you think hard and do some research, you will be able to come up with even more benefits to present to your employer.

The next step requires you to be tuned into your employer on another level. What possible objections will they have to your telecommuting? Write down the possible objections and then come up with focused answers. Will your employer feel that work teams cannot be successful with one member out of the office? If so, you can point out that collaboration can continue at a distance since the advent of e-mail, cell phones, conference calls, and all the working wonders now available. Will your employer be concerned about security and safety of company materials? If so, you can point out that there are many solutions for remote access security both online and in the telecommuter's home office.

YOUR BEST CHANCE TO TELECOMMUTE

When seeking a telecommuting position, remember that the majority of telecommuting that is happening today is being done at small companies, not major corporations. Although there are a few outstanding examples of family-friendly corporations, those are the exception to the rule. Flexibility is found in the innovative small businesses more than in corporate structure.

As we said earlier in this e-book, it is easier to find telecommuting or freelance assignments with a variety of businesses than it is to get hired as a full-time telecommuter. When work is being done on a remote location, distance does not really matter. Many more companies are willing to use remote workers for short-term defined projects than to commit to a full-time agreement.

CHAPTER 6

PREPARING AN EFFECTIVE ONLINE RESUME

If you want to apply for jobs online, you need a resume that works, both in content and design.

Your resume is a marketing tool. Because you are unable to make a personal impression, it has to do the job for you. It must convey your value, your experience and convince the reader that you are the perfect person to do the job. It must set you apart from your competition and open doors for you.

Preparing a resume to submit online is a different process than mailing a paper resume. You cannot make an impression with nice paper or typeface and often it is not possible to use a cover letter. In fact, the words you write and your preparation are the only things that can impress. This can be a good thing.

You are probably used to seeing resumes that detail your current and/or previous jobs in chronological order, beginning with the most recent. This is the standard format, and the most acceptable. However, if you have not worked for a while, or your work experience is not current there is another way to arrange your resume. It is called a functional format. When you use this method, you can emphasize all of your skills and accomplishments, even those you have not been paid to do.

Here's how it works: Create headings that describe the types of work you have done such as "Public Relations", "Organizer", or "Special Event Coordinator" and include experiences you have had as a volunteer or in your personal life. Do you love people? Then you have excellent interpersonal skills. If you are computer literate, say so and list the types of programs you can use. If you are bilingual, be sure to note that too. Actual previous employment and contact information can be given at the end of the resume.

If you have successfully completed other telecommuting and freelance assignments, be sure to include that information. And remember, when you write your resume, do it with the expectation that you will succeed. Your confidence will shine through.

HOW TO PREPARE YOUR E-RESUME

Here are some tips to help you prepare your e-resume for submission:

- Type everything flush left.
- Put your name, address, telephone number, e-mail address and other pertinent contact information at the top.
- Use a job objective statement at the top of your resume, and change your objective when necessary to fit the situation.
- Job sites may extract key words from your resume when selecting qualified applicants for a position. Be sure to include all of the key words that will help you be chosen for the jobs you desire.
- When using dates, stick to years and leave out months.
- Remove all formatting codes and do not use bullets, underlining, bolded letters or italics.
- When e-mailing your resume, do not send it as an attachment. Put it in the body of your e-mail.
- Write enough information to fit on one page.

CHAPTER 7

ONE MORE OPTION: CREATING YOUR OWN OPPORTUNITIES

The increase in actual jobs, telecommuting and freelance work assignments now available on the Web is very encouraging for all homeworking moms. However, you don't have to rely 100% on getting others to give you work projects. You can create your own by starting a home-based business using the skills you have now or those that you can learn. Writing, web design, data processing....any skill can be transformed into a business.

Did you know that the latest research from International Data Corporation shows that nearly 8,500 new home businesses are started every day in the US? 8,500 a day!
